**H**IS Catholick Majesty has thought fit to remove Don Francisco Moreno from the Employment of Intendant General of the Marines, (which was conferred on him but 10 Days ago) and has named in his Room Don Gaspar de Narbona, who still retains the Employment of Councillour of the King's Finances. A Courier arrived last Thursday at the Pardo, dispatched by the Marquess de St. Philippe the King of Spain's Minister at the Hague, with the News that the Province of Holland had come to a Resolution to accede to the Treaty of Hanover. Some Days ago a great Quantity of Snuff, introduced by Fraud, being found in a House adjoining to the Venetian Ambassadour's by the Guards and Officers of Justice, the Owner of the said Snuff escaped into the Ambassadour's House, but afterwards fell into the Hands of the Guards, who carried him to Prison: But his Catholick Majesty having been informed of the Case, commanded he should be immediately restored to the Ambassadour, to avoid infringing the Privileges and Immunities allowed here to a publick Minister. Yesterday his Catholick Majesty declared the Duke of Ripperda Superintendent General of all the Revenues of the Spanish Monarchy, and he still holds all the other Employments he had before.
