Madrid, March 18, N. S.

**O**N the 13th Instant Don Gaspar de Narbona, on whom his Catholick Majesty lately conferred the Employment of President of the Contractation-House at Cadiz, and of Superintendent of the Marine Affairs, as also of the Revenues of Seville, set out from hence for Cadiz, where he is to reside on Account of his said Employments. On the 15th Instant the Duke de Ripperda was again taken ill of the Gout; he keeps his Bed at the Buen Retiro, where his Catholick Majesty has given him an Appartment near his Secretary's Office. Yesterday a Courier dispatched from Vienna on the 1st Instant by Count Tarouca his Portuguese Majesty's Ambassador at the Imperial Court, passed through here on his Way to Lisbon: He came by Munich, and brought an Account of the Death of the Elector of Bavaria. There is no Advice yet of the three Muscovite Ships having sailed from St. Andero for the Baltick.
