**T**HE King has nominated Baron Palavicini de St. Remi, to be Viceroy of Sardinia, in the Room of M. del Maro. M. Brascardi, who is Colonel of the Regiment of Monferrat, is appointed to go to Sardinia, to command the Forces there with the Commission of Captain-General of Arms; and the Count de Morette is appointed to be the chief Officer of the Horse in that Kingdom. It is said the Command of the Regiment of Monferrat will be given to the Marquess de Carail. Some Days ago died here the Princess Louise of Savoy, Sister of Prince Eugene, in her 59th Year. Orders are given for new cloathing the Militia, and Tents are ordered to be made for the regular Forces in Savoy and Piedmont. The Court will go into Mourning for three Months, for the Death of the late Elector of Bavaria.

Hague, April 5, N. S. M. Ganfnot the Bavarian Minister, delivered Yesterday to the States-General a Letter from the Elector, notifying the Death of the late Elector his Father, and his own Accession to that Electorate. The said Minister presented at the same Time to their High Mightinesses his new Credentials: And having made the like Notification by his Secretary to all the Foreign Ministers, they have made him their Visits. The States of the Province of Holland are to assemble here on the 10th Instant.

London, March 28. Yesterday dyed Sir Jeremiah Murden, one of the Sheriffs for the City of London and County of Middlesex.
