Madrid, March 25, N. S.

THE Duke de Ripperda is recovered of his late Fit of the Gout; his Catholick Majesty has lately allowed him 48000 Pieces of Eight per Annum for his Appointments, and has also been pleased to grant to the Dutchess de Ripperda a yearly Pension of 4000 Pieces of Eight, which last is to be paid out of the Produce of the Tobacco Revenues. The Council of the Indies will dispatch To-morrow for Cadiz Orders to be sent to the Governours in the West-Indies by two Advice-Boats now ready to sail from the said Port, one for Vera-Cruz, and the other for Cartagena. The King of Spain's Master-Builder for Ships M. Boger, has been ordered down to St. Andero, where he is to finish with all Expedition two Spanish Men of War now lying upon the Stocks there. Prince Galizkin the Muscovite Minister at this Court, having received his Recredential Letters from his Court, will in a few Days take his Audience of Leave of their Catholick Majesties and return to Petersbourg; it is said that Prince Sharbutoff, who is at present at Cadiz, will be appointed by the Czarina to succeed him Yesterday an Order from his Catholick Majesty was sent to the Treasury, suspending the Payments of any Assignments and Bills whatsoever till further Direction. Yesterday in the Morning the Infante Don Carlos received for the first time the Communion in the Church of St. Jerome near the Buen Retiro, and the same Afternoon he was taken ill of a Fever, but is somewhat better to Day. An Advice-Boat from the West-Indies arrived at Cadiz on the 20th Instant, bringing Notice (as is given out) that the Flota from the Vera Cruz may be expected at Cadiz by next Summer, but that the Galeons at Portobelo cannot be got ready to return to Spain till the next Year. The last Advices from St. Andero are, that the three Muscovite Ships were ready to sail from thence with the first fair Wind.
