**T**HE Resident of Bavaria at this Court having received a Courier from Munich with Letters of Notification to their Catholick Majesties of the Death of the Elector of Bavaria, had on the 28th past an Audience of their Catholick Majesties, in which he presented to them the said Letters, and the Day after Orders were given for the whole Court to go into Mourning. The Infante Don Carlos continues still Sick of an intermitting Fever, but is not reckoned to be in any Danger. Yesterday being the Birth-day of the Infanta of Spain betrothed to the Prince of Brazil, the entering into the 9th Year of her Age, all the Grandees and Nobility appeared at Court upon that Occasion, and kissed their Catholick Majesties Hands. The Queen of Spain's Confessor Don Domingo Guerra, was consecrated Yesterday Morning with great Ceremony in the Church of St. Jerome near the Buen Retiro, as Titular Archbishop, in the Presence of their Catholick Majesties and the whole Court. Letters from Cadiz of the 26th past advise, that the two Advice-Boats which have been got ready there for some Time, are to sail forthwith for the West-Indies. The last Letters from St. Andro relate, that the three Muscovite Ships which for some Weeks lay in that Harbour, are sailed from thence Northwards.
