That the feweral Reduced Officers now in Half-Pay up on the Establishment of Great Britain, are required to appear in Person before the several Persons, and at the Places and Times herein after respectively mentioned; viz.

All the Reduced Officers now on Half Pay refiding in any Parts of Great-Britain, (Scotland excepted) lefore a Board confifting of General Officers, and others appointed for that Purpofe, who will meet in the Great Room at the Horfe Guards, Whitehall, on Wednefday the 4th Day of May next, and will fit there every Wednefday and Friday from and after the 3d Day of the faid Month, to the 8th Day of June next following, at Ien of the Clock in the Forenoon on each of the faid Days.

All the Reduced Officers now on Half Pay refiding in that Part of Great-Britain called Scotland, before the Honourable Major-General Wade, Commander in Chief of His Majefty's Forces there, or before the Officer or Officers appointed by him for this Service, on the Days and Places as it hall be hereafter published by his Order in the publick Prints of Edinburgh.

All the Reduced Officers now on Half Pay in Great-Britain residing in the Kingdom of Ireland, before the Right Honourable Richard Lord Viscount Shannon, or the Contander in Chief of His Majesty's Forces in that Kingdom, an the Places and on the Days as it shall be hereafter published by his Order in the publick Prints of Dublin.

And the faid Reduced Officers are feverally to be prepared to (hew, that they are the respective Persons who have been found to be entituled to Half Pay on the British Establishment; and such of the faid Reduced Officers as shall not appear, and show themselves entituled to Half Pay, as aforefaid, before some, or one of the Persons, at some, or one of the Places, or on one of the Days before-mentioned, will be taken to be dead, or providedfor by some Place of Profit, or Civil Employment under His Majesty, and will be omitted in the next Establishment of Half-Pay.
