*From on board His Majesty's Ship the Torbay in Copenhagen-Road, April 26.*

**O**N the 23d Instant at Night, Sir Charles Wager, with the Squadron of His Majesty's Ships under his Command, came to an Anchor in this Road. Yesterday he had an Audience of the King of Denmark, was received very graciously, and presented Sir George Walton and the Commanders of the Ships to His Majesty. Sir Charles Wager had the Honour to Dine at the King's Table: Sir George Walton, and the other Commanders, were entertained at another Table by the King's Officers. We are preparing to proceed up the Baltick.

*Copenhagen, April 30.* The Lord Glenorchy arrived here on the 27th Instant, in nine Days from Utrecht; and this Morning had Audience of the King of Denmark. Sir Charles Wager with the Squadron of Ships he commands, is in a Readiness to sail with the first Opportunity of Wind, which has been contrary ever since his Arrival here.
