Lisbon, May 4, N. S.

THE 2d Instant being the Birth-Day of the Infante Dom-Carlos, was observed at Court with the usual Solemnity. The three Dutch Men of War that came in lately to careen, are making all possible Expedition to return to their Cruize at the Streights Mouth. Vice-Admiral Somersdyck, with his Part of the Squadron, are to come here to clean as soon as they are relieved by these Ships. We have an Account of a Murder that was committed in the Month of March last, on board an English Vessel called the William and Elizabeth. That Ship having passed the Streights Mouth, the Crew mutined and murdered William Mitchel the Master: They afterwards left the Ship on the Coast of Portugal, and came on Shore at Lagos in Algarve, where they dispersed and fled different Ways to secure themselves. Two of them escaped from Villa Nova in Algarve before the Fact was known, but four of the Crew were seized on the 3d of April last at St. Ubes, and are now in Prison there. It is said that the Marquess d'Abrantes will set out in a very short time for Madrid.

Copenhagen, May 7, O. S. The Wind coming Westerly the 2d Instant, Sir Charles Wager, with the Squadron of His Britannick Majesty's Ships of War under his Command, proceeded from hence on the 3d at Four in the Morning, towards the Heighth of Stockholm; since which a Vessel is come in, that saw him off Ysted, holding on his Course with a fair Wind.
