AN humble Address of the Representatives of the Freemen of the Province of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met the 27th of November 1725; As also, An humble Address of His Majesty's Protestant Subjects called Quakers, from their yearly Meeting held at Philadelphia in the Province of Pennsylvania; having been transmitted from thence to his Grace the Duke of Newcastle one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, have by him been presented to His Majesty.

Which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

Madrid, May 6, N. S. On the 30th past, the Royal Spanish Academy went in a Body to the Palace, and presented to the King and Queen the first Volume of the Dictionary of the Castilian Language composed by them. The 1st Instant being the Festival of St. Philip, whose Name the King bears, his Majesty received on that Occasion the Compliments of the Foreign Ambassadors and of the Grandees. On the 2d Instant, the Ambassadors residing at this Court received circular Letters from the Secretary of State, inviting them in his Catholick Majesty's Name to come to the Queen of Spain's Apartment at the Palace, as soon as they shall receive Notice of her being in Labour, in order to assist as Witnesses of the Birth of the Child her Majesty shall bring forth: And his Catholick Majesty having given Orders for preparing a Bull-Feast in the Plaza Mayor here, to be performed for publick Rejoycing after the Queen's Delivery, the Corregidor is making the necessary Dispositions for the said Feast.

Hague, May 28, N. S. We have an Account, that Vice-Admiral Sommelsdyck being cruising in the Streights with three Ships of his Squadron, gave Chace to an Algerine of 45 Guns the 20th of last Month. She made for the Bay of Tetuan, at the Entrance of which she struck upon a Rock, and was lost; but her Crew had time to save themselves ashore. The States of the Province of Holland are to assemble here To-morrow.
