IS Majesty came this Day to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes feated on the Throne, with the usual Solemnity, Sir William Sanderson, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Message from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers; the Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Affent to

An Act for repealing the Duty laid upon Snuff, by An Ast made in the Eighth Year of Her late Ma-jesty's Reign, and for ascertaining the Rates according to which the remaining Duties are to be paid; and for giving further Encouragement to the Greenland Fishery.
