IS Majesty came this Day to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes feated on the Throne, with the usual Solemnity, Sir William Sanderson, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was sent with a Mes-fage from His Majesty to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers ; the Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Affent to

- An Att for repealing the Duty laid upon Snuff, by An All made in the Eighth Year of Her late Ma-jefty's Reign, and for aftertaining the Rates according to which the remaining Duties are to be paid; and for giving further Encouragement to the Greenland Fishery.
- An Att for welting in His Majefty an Imposition of Two Pennies Scots upon all Ale and Beer brew-ad and fold in the City of Glasgow, and Pri-wileges thereof, for fatisfying the Damages and Loffes which Daniel Gampbell, Efq; lately fuf-ford in a Birt there fered in a Riot there.
- An Act for the Improvement of His Majefty's Revenues of Cuftoms, Excife, and Inland Duties.
- An All for better fecuring the Monies and Effelis of the Suitors of the Court of Chancery 3 and to prevent the Counterfeiting of East-India Bonds and Indorfements thereon, as likewise Indorfements on South-Sea Bonds.
- An Act for Relief of the Suitors of the High Court of Chancery.
- An Alt to prevent unlawful Combinations of Workmen employed in the Woollen Manufactures, and for better Payment of their Wages:
- An Alt to prevent frivolous and vexatious Arrefts. An Alt for the better regulating Tryals by Nish Prius in the County of Middlefex.

- An Aff for continuing an Aff made in the Ninth Tear of His Majefty's Reign, entituled, An Aff for the more effectual punifoing wicked and evil disposed Persons going armed in Disguise, and doing Injuries and Violences to the Persons and Properties of His Majesty's Subjects, and for the more speedy bringing the Offenders to Jus-tice. tice.
