St. James's, May 30.

Saturday last being His Majesty's Birth-Day, the Celebration of it at Court was deferred till to Day; when there was a very numerous and splendid Appearance here of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction, and at Night a Ball. The usual publick Demonstrations of Joy were shewn on this Occasion throughout London and Westminster.

Stockholm, May 11, O.S. Sir Charles Wager, with the British Squadron under his Command, sailed from Copenhagen the 2d Instant, and on the 6th came to an Anchor at Ellensabb near this Place. The 8th Sir Charles Wager came to Town, and Yesterday had Audience of the King of Sweden in the Presence of several of the Senators, being introduced by Mr. Poyntz the British Envoy Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, and delivered a Letter from the King his Master to his Swedish Majesty; by whom he was very graciously received, and afterwards had the Honour, together with Mr. Poyntz, to dine with his Majesty.

Hambourg, May 31, N. S. Letters from Petersbourg of the 14th Instant advise, that the Czarina had fixed the 12th of next Month for her Departure from thence for Riga, and that the Duke of Holstein was to accompany her. We have a Report here, that the Russians have suspended the fitting out their large Men of War, and are now equipping some Frigates. We have an Account from Copenhagen, that the Squadron of Danish Men of War sailed on the 25th Instant for the Island of Bornholm.
