St. James's, May 30.

Aturday last being His Majesty's Birth-Day, the Celebration of it at Court was deferred till to Day; when there was a very numerous and fplendid Appearance here of the Nobility and other Persons of Diffinction, and at Night a Ball. The usual publick Demonstrations of Joy were shewn on this Occasion throughout London and Westminster.

Stockholm, May 11, O.S. Sir Charles Wager, with the British Squadron under his Command, failed from Copenhagen the 2d Inftant, and on the 6th came to an Anchor at Elfenable near this Place. The 8th Sir Charles Wager came to Town, and Yefferday had Audience of the King of Sweden in the Prefence of feveral of the Senators, being introduced by Mr. Poyntz the British Envoy Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, and delivered a Letter from the King his Master to his Swedish Majefty; by whom he was very gracioully received, and afterwards had the Honour, together with Mr. Poyntz, to dine with his Majefty.

Hambourg, May 31, N. S. Letters from Peters-bourg of the 14th Inftant advife, that the Czarina had fixed the 12th of next Month for her Depar-ture from thence for Riga, and that the Duke of Holftein was to accompany her. We have a Re-port here, that the Ruffians have fulpended the fitting out their large Men of War, and are now equipping fome Frigates. We have an Account from Copenhagen, that the Squadron of Danish Men of War failed on the 25th Inftant for the Island of Bornholm.

Whitchiall, May 30, 1726. Whereat it has been represented to His Majesiy, that as the fix following Regiments are coming from Ireland to Great Britain, viz. one Batallion of the Royal Regito Great Britain, Viz. one Baranion of the Royal Regi-ment of Foot, commanded by the Right Honourable the Earl of Orkney, and the Regiments of Foot commanded by Colonel Newton, Colonel Howard, Colonel Defney, Colonel Middleton, and Colonel Anfiruther, many pri-wate Soldiers may have formerly deferted from them, and fince inlifted themfelves in other Regiments in Cract Britain and that diams Soldiers who did Forman Great Britain, and that divers Soldiers who did former-Great Brians, and that avers solaters who dia jormer-ly belong to the Regiments now in Great Britain, may have deferted from them, and entored themfelves in fome of the Six Regiments of Foot above-mentioned : His Majefty is therefore graciously pleas'd hereby to grant bis Pardon to all fuch Soldiers who may have deferted in the Manner as aforefaid, before the 1st Day of this Inftant May inclusive, and who are now in any of the laid fix Regiment, or in any of them in Great Reirain. faid fix Regiments, or in any of them in Great Britain, and likewife to declare, that it is His Royal Intention, they foall continue in His Service as they now are, without being molefied or claimed by the Officers of the refpective Corps to whom they did formerly belong.
