**H**IS Portuguese Majesty, in Regard to the deplorable State of Slavery which great Numbers of his Subjects suffer in Algiers, has been pleased to order a General Redemption of Captives to be published by the Tribunal da Consciencia; in pursuance of which, two Fathers of the Redemption set out Yesterday for the Coast of Barbary. His Majesty has lately purchased the Houses of the Conde d'Aveiro, and Dom Pedro Vasconcellos, at Belem. Three Dutch Men of War that were here careening under the Command of Rear-Admiral Van Coperen, sailed on the 20th past for the Streights, as will in a few Days his Britannick Majesty's Ship the Colchester. The 25th past being the Birth Day of the Infant Dom Francisco, who then entered into his 37th Year, was observed at Court with the usual Ceremony: There was a great Concourse of Nobility to kiss his Royal Highness's Hand upon that Occasion. Letters from Cadiz relate, that Orders were lately come from Madrid to put a stop to the Naval Preparations there; and that in pursuance of it, they were actually beginning to take out of the Ships, the Cannon and Provisions which had been put on board.

Madera, April 21, O. S. Vice Admiral Hoffer, with the Squadron under his Command, arrived here the 16th Instant at Night: The Greyhound arrived the 13th, and sailed on the 15th. The Squadron have got all their Stores of Wine on board, and will proceed on their Voyage this Evening.
