ETTERS from Petersbourg of the 20th of May, O. S. advife, that the Czarina's Court was under the greateft Uneafinefs and Confternation at the News of the Britifh Fleet's advancing that Way, and had immediately given Orders for reinforcing the Garrifons of Wibourg, Cronflot, Revel, and Riga. A Merchant Ship which came from Revel the 20th of May brings an Account, that an Express was come thither from Petersbourg with Orders forthwith to unrig the Men of War that were equipped there, and to land the Ammunition and Provisions which were on board them; which was accordingly done the Night after the Express arrived; and the Ships were at the fame Time haled up as high into the Harbour as poffible; three or four Regiments were likewife ordered to march into that Town immediately to reinforce the Garrifon.
