Lisbon, June 15, N. S.

ON the 11th Instant Vice-Admiral Sommeldyck, with the Dutch Squadron under his Command, arrived here from the Streights. The same Day Mr. Dormer, His Britannick Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary at this Court, gave an Entertainment upon Occasion of His Majesty's Birth-Day, at which were present the Foreign Ministers, and most of the chief Nobility: A Piece of Musick consisting of two Acts was performed in the Evening, after which there was a Ball: Upon the Signal of the Fire-Works, the Dutch Squadron gave a Salute with their Cannon: This Entertainment was deferred until the 11th, the Anniversary of His Majesty's Birth-Day being on Whitson-Eve. By a Ship lately arrived here from Brazil the Court has received an Account of the Discovery of some new Gold Mines a great Way up in the Country: It is said they are very rich, and that large Pieces of Ore have been found almost upon the Surface of the Earth, from one to two Hundred Octavas Weight.

Madrid, June 17, N. S. On the 11th Instant, between Seven and Eight a-Clock in the Morning, the Queen of Spain was brought to Bed of a Princess, who was baptized the same Day, and named Donna Maria Antonia; in the Afternoon his Catholick Majesty went in his Coach with a great Retinue through the Town to the Convent of our Lady d'Atocha, where he gave Thanks for the Queen's happy Delivery.

The Commissioners for managing His Majesty's Stamp Duties do hereby give Notice, That by an Act of the last Sessions of Parliament, Entituled, An Act for the Relief of the Suitors of the High Court of Chancery, it is enacted, that from and after the 2d of August next the following Duties shall be paid, viz.

For every Piece of Vellum, or Parchment, or Piece of Paper, upon which any Original Writ (except such Original on which a Writ of Capias Issues) Subpoena, Bill of Middlesex, Latitas, Writ of Capias, Quominus, Writ of Dedimus, Petition to take Answers, examine Witnesses, or appoint Guardians, or any other Writ whatsoever, or any other Process or Mandate that shall issue out of, or pass the Seals of any the Courts at Westminster, Courts of Great Sessions in Wales, Courts in Counties Palatine, or any other Courts whatsoever holding Plea, where the Debt or Damage doth amount to 40 s. or above, or the Thing in Demand is of that Value, shall be Ingrossed or Written, (Writs of Covenant for levying Fines, Writs of Entry for suffering common Recoveries, and Writs of Habeas Corpus, always excepted) the Sum of Sixpence.

For every Piece of Vellum, Parchment, or Paper, upon which any Entry of any Action in the Mayor's and Sheriff's Courts of London, and in Courts in all Corporations, and other Courts whatsoever, out of which no Writs, Process, or Mandates issue, holding Plea, where the Debt or Damage doth amount to 40 s. or above, shall be Ingrossed or Written, the Sum of Sixpence, and for every Piece of Vellum, Parchment, or Paper, upon which shall be Ingrossed or Written any Citation or Monition made in any Ecclesiastical Court, the Sum of Sixpence.

Which said Duties are made payable under the Penalties, Forfeitures and Disabilities mentioned and contained in a Statute made in the Ninth Year of the Reign of King William the Third, relating to other Stamp Duties.
