Madrid, July 15, N. S.

IS Catholick Majefty has ordered, that the Bull Feaft which was to have been performed on the 23d Inftant fhall be held a Day fooner; and his Journey to St. Ildefonfo which was to have been on the 27th, is ordered for the 24th Inftant. On the roth Count Konigfeck, the Emperour's Ambaffadour, came from his Country-Houfe, in order to ftay here till the Court goes to St. Ildefonfo, whither he is to follow, and to be lodged in the King's Houfe at Balfayn a League from thence; on the 12th he had an Audience of their Catholick Majefries. Letters from Cadiz of the 9th Inftant advife, that the Governour there having received a Letter from Court, acquianting him that fome Seamen fulfected of having the Plague were in the Lazareto of Leghorn, he had a Meeting with the Magiftrates upon it, in which they refolved that all Ships coming in from the Meterranean fhould be vifited. Letters from Malaga of the 9th relate, that four Spanih Gallies arrived there from Cadiz on the 3d, and failed the next Day for Cartagena, from whence they are to go to Barcelonz, where they will joyn four other Gallies.

Madrid, July 22, N. S. The Britifh Ambaffadour Mr. Stanhope having received by a Meffenger the King his Mafter's Orders upon what had paffed on Occasion of the Duke of Ripperda's taking Refuge in his Houfe, prefented on the 13th Inftant a Memorial to his Catholick Majefty by the Hands of the Marquefs de la Paz : On the 14th his Excellency went to the Paláce, and had a Conference with the faid Marquefs : On the 20th his Excellency had an Audience of the King and Queen, in which he complimented them on the Birth of the Infanta, and on the Queen's Recovery from her lying in ; and was very gracioufly received by their Catholick Majefties. The Duke of Wharton has openly profefied himfelf a Roman Catholick, by making his publick Abjuration of the Proteftant Religion, and by going through all the other Ceremonies practifed upon fuch Occafions.

Paris, July 31, N. S. Yefterday Morning all the Foreign Ministers were admitted to make their Court to his most Christian Majesty in his Bed-Chamber: His Majesty appeared with fo fresh and healthful a Countenance, that it was hardly visible he had been Sick.
