ON the 16th Instant three Dutch Men of War under the Command of Rear-Admiral Cooper, came into this Port to careen: On the 25th came in a Dutch Man of War of Fifty Guns from Amsterdam: The said Rear-Admiral with his Three Ships sail'd Yesterday for the Streights; but the other Dutch Man of War remains here, in Expectation of three more Ships, with which she is to go and joyn Vice-Admiral Someldyck's Squadron in the Streights. Four Noblemen who were lately banished by his Portuguese Majesty, have been recalled. On the 26th a Serenata was performed at Court, all the Nobility being present, that being the Festival of the Saint whose Name the Queen of Portugal bears. On Sunday the 30th of last Month an Auto de Fé was held at Coimbra, when the Tribunal of the Inquisition pass'd Sentence of Imprisonment and divers other Penalties upon Forty Eight Men, and Forty Seven Women, for various Crimes; and the Effigies were brought out of two Persons who had died in the Prisons of the Inquisition.
