UR Magistrates and Burghers have chosen Eight Representatives of this City for the Dyet which is to be opened the Beginning of next Month. Count Bonde, President of the College of Mines, who was the Beginning of last Year sent as Head of a Commission that was appointed to inquire into the Grounds of the many Complaints that were made to the last Dyet of great Abuses committed both by the Civil and Military Officers in Finland, returned from that Dutchy some Days ago; and it is said he will be a Candidate for the Post of Land-Marshal at the approaching Dyet.
