*Stockholm, August 10.*

**T**HE Court has been some time at Carlberg, and it is believed will continue at that Palace as long as the good Weather lasts. On the 4th Instant the King of Sweden went to take the Diversion of Hunting on an Island in this Neighbourhood called Warmboen, from whence his Majesty returned on Sunday the 7th to Carlberg. The next Day his Majesty designed to be present in the Senate, but was in the Morning so much indisposed that he was obliged to keep his Bed most of the Day; but his Majesty was Yesterday so well again, that he accompanied the Queen to the Palace of Drotningholm, where their Majesties dined, and returned in the Evening to Carlberg. In the Night between the 3d and 4th of this Month, died at his House in this Town, after a long Indisposition, the Field-Marshal and Senator Count Erick Sparre; and on Sunday his Corpse was deposited in the Church of the Gray Fryars here, in order to be conveyed to the burying Place of his Ancestors at his Seat called Sundby. The Swedish Envoy at Petersbourg having lately given an Account that the Czarina designed to send the Duke of Holstein's First Minister M. Bassewitz as her Ambassadour to this Court against the Meeting of

the next Dyet, and the better to qualify him for that Post, had made him one of her Privy Council, the Senate thereupon took that Matter some Days ago into Deliberation, and passed a Resolution, that whereas the said Privy-Councillour had on divers Occasions spoke with great Contempt both of the King and the whole Swedish Nation, they could not therefore admit him under any Character to come and reside in this Kingdom; which Resolution has not only since been notified both to the Muscovite and Holstein Ministers here, but the Swedish Envoy at Petersbourg is also ordered to acquaint the Russian Court therewith.

*From on Board His Majesty's Ship the Union off the Groyne, Aug. 10.* Sir John Jennings, with the Squadron of His Majesty's Ships under his Command, took his Departure from the Lizard the 25th of last Month, and on the 30th fell in with Cape Pinas. Before he came the Length of St. Andero, with which he stood in as near as he judged convenient the 1st Instant, he detached the Lord Forbes in the Canterbury, with the Cruizer Sloop, to put an Officer ashore with a Letter to the Commander in Chief there, and bring him off again. In the mean Time Sir John Jennings with the rest of the Squadron made for the Bay of St. Antonio, where the Lord Forbes joynd

ed him, and there the Squadron came to an Anchor on the 3d. Upon our coming in, the Spaniards fired a few Shot at the foremost Ships, but the Commanding Officer of the Place excused it in the best Manner he could to the Officer whom Sir John sent immediately ashore. There were but two Spanish Ships of War at St. Andero of 60 or 70 Guns each. All the Regular Troops that could be drawn to the Coast, from St. Sebastian quite to the Groyne, were about 3000 Men, and upon Notice of our coming posted themselves mostly at St. Andero and St. Antonio; and by all Reports they were in a bad Condition. Sir John Jennings with his Squadron came off the Groyne the 8th Instant.
