it. Aufle Extraordinary Envoy hath lignified to the entres, that his Miftrils the Queen of Spain, it. had at length declared herself on the subject of the Defensive League, concluded with this State, and that they might very fuddainly expect her Majefties Ratification ; and fome report, that it is already ar-rived. Prince Maurits may in a day or two, together with the Deputies of the Council of State, part hence towards our leveral Garrifons on the Rhyn, to take a farther account of the prefent condition of those places. This day the new Officers took the Oath of Fidelity before the Council of State; it is faid, fome of them have already their Companies almost compleat, having before they had their Commissions, taken Men on provisionally, which may very much forward these Leavies, ₿y Letters from our Amballador at Stockholme, we have advice, that their Majessies had begun their jour-ney to the Copper Mines, and that he had not yet had Audience of their Majesties, they desiring it. might be deferred till their return, which may be about the begining of the next Month, press which lately went hence with dispatches to ourse obliged to act accordingly.

Burtue, is arrived here from Gapenhagen, on his return for England. The Duke of Samen Lawenburgh, is faid, to have lately passed this place incognito, on his way to Copenhagen. The Offi-cers employed by the Bilhop of Munster in his new Leavies, are mole gone for Mechalenburgh, baving found the people herezbouts very unwilling to go into that fervice,

The difcourse here is, that the Dukes of Lunen-burgh will fend several Troops into the service of the States General of the United Provinces. From Berlin they write, of the great endeayors that are there uled by the Heer d'Amerongen, the Dutch Minister, to induce his Electoral Highness to declare in favor of the States his Masters. Here are Letters in Town arrived from Mofcam, which speak of new troubles raised in several parts of that Empiro by the Rebels, and that the Czar was preparing a confiderable Army against Spring, for the quieting those diforders.

Paris, Feb. 13. The King having, fince the death of the Chancellor, resolved to keep the Seals as yes in his own hands, hath appointed fix of his ordinary Councellors, and the like number of his Mafters of Requests, to have the care of preparing things, and Sealing them one day every week in his Prefence. til he shall have thought fit otherwise to dispose of the Seals, with farther Orders to be observed by them, in the executing the fame: The fixth and eighth instant, by reason of the many dispatches that were ready for the Seal, were appointed for the palling them, which was accordingly done in the Kings Prefence, who was pleafed to fign the feveral inftruments himfelf, and to write with his own hand whatever the Chancellor had formerly ufed to do.

The ninth' instant, Don Miquel Thuriesta, Refident here on the part of the Crown of Spain, had his Audience of leave of the King, in order to his return front this Court, he being appointed by the Queen of Spain, to be her Secretary of Spate in Elanders.

The fifth the Heart of the Princels de Conti being embalmed, and enclosed in a Box of Silver, was carried by the Datchels of Longueville, accompanied by the Dutchels of Briffac, and feveral other Persons of the most eminent Quality , to the great Convent of the Carmalities where it was received by the Bishop of Authur, affisted by the Religious of these Order with the usual Ceremonics: The King to express the effect he had of the great worth of this decealed Lady, hath been pleafed to declare, that he will have a particular care of the education of her two Sons, the Prince de Conti, and the Prince de la Roche fur gon , and that they shall be brought up with the Dauphin. The 10 the Extraordinary Envoy from the Elector of Brandenburgh, was conducted to his first Audience of the King; what his errand may be, is not certainly faid.

The Mareshal de Crequi is arrived from Nancy, and hath been very kindly received by the King. This week was performed by the Capucins of this place, in their Church, a fglemn fervice for the late Chancellor, as having been their Protector. From Madrid our last Letters tell us, that it was reported there, that the Queen Regent had ratified the Treaty concluded lately by her Envoy Don Emanuel de Lyra at the Haguen and that our Ambaffador at that Court, the Marquis de Villars, had declared, that in cafe her Majefty affisted the Ene The Ex. mies of this Crown, the King his Master would be

Ambaflador in England is returned hither. The is faid, that the Emperor hath fent to offer his Hamburgh, Feb. 19 The English Envoy Mr. Mediation to the King, for the endeavoring to reconcile those misunderstandings, which may be at present between him and the. States General of the United Provinces. The King hath, as we are told, conferred on the Sieur d' Almeras, the Title of Marquis, together with the charge of Reer Admiral of France, having at the fame time fent him a Commiffion to command this Summer a Squadron of men of War in the Medizerranean, as the Sieue de Martell is likewife to da. From Rechel they write, of feveral confiderable men of War that are there fitting out, and that they may in two Months at far-thest be ready to pur to Sea. Madam, is at present perfectly well again, to the great fatisfaction of this Court. The Count de Conningsmark, who is at present raising Forces for the Service of this Crown, is, as we are told, to como and relide here, as Extraordinary Ambaflador from the Crown of Sweden. The Marquis de Filleroy is by the Kings order ratired from Court.
