The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

His Majesty in Council was this Day pleased to order, that the Parliament which stands prorogued to Thursday the 8th of this Instant, should be further proregued to Thursday the 10th Day of November next.

Westminster, September 8.

This Day the Parliament was further prorogued to Thursday the 10th Day of November next.

Liston, Sept. 7, N. S. Sir John Jennings with His Britannick Majesty's Ships under his Com-mand, failed from hence the 1st Instant. The Evening before, his Portuguese Majesty went to perform his Devotions at the Convent of St. Joseph near Belem; in his Return he passed over the Strand near the Place where the English Ships lay at Anchor, and was faluted by the Admiral and his whole Squadron. Last Week a French Ship arrived here from Havre de Grace, having on board two magnificent Coaches and a Litter, Part of the Equipage of the Marquels de los Balbases, who is shortly expected at this Court from Madrid. This Day, being the Birth Day of her Portuguese Majesty, is observed at Court with great Solemnity: In the Morning her Majesty received the Compliments of all the Nobility upon the Occasion, and in the Evening there will be a Serenata at the Palace

Portsmouth, Sept. 6. The Spence Sloop, Captain Berkeley Commander, arrived Yesterday at St. Hel-Jens from the Bastimentos off of Porto Bello, where fhe left Vice-Admiral Hosier with the Squadron of His Majesty's Ships under his Command, the 28th of June last. The Admiral arrived there the 6th of that Month; and was informed that the Royal George, a large Ship belonging to the South-Sea-Company, was in Porto Bello disposing of her Cargo that was very confiderable; which being done, and all the Money paid for the same, amounting to a very large Sum, received on though, she joyned the Squadron; and was shore-ly to fill for England and a fill for England and ly to fail for England under a sufficient Convoy. By the Spence Sloop we have also an Account, that the Galleons have not had the like Success in the Sale of their Cargoes, having disposed of few or none of the Goods they carried to Porto Bello; that ten Days before the Arrival of His Majesty's Squadron there, a Packet Boat from Old Spain had brought Orders, for the Money on board them to be put on Shore and carried back to Panama, which had accordingly been done; that the Fair at Porto Bello was over, and that there was no Probability that the Galleons could come away this Season, they and the Men of War that were to have convoyed them being actually unrigging in Porto Bello.
