FOR thefe three Weeks palt Workmen have been continually employed in building new Stables at the Royal Palace for about 200 Horfes: And an Apartment is fitting up with the rame Expedition, as it is faid, for the Prince of Brazil ; whofe Houfhold it is thought will be appointed by his Portuguefe Majefty before the Marquefs de los Balbales arrives from Spain. He is expected here before the End of November, and 'tis believed the Marquefs de Abrantes will fet out for Madrid the Beginning of the fame Month. Orders were iffuedlaft Week for the advancing of Sixty Thoufand Crowns to the faid Marquefs de Abrantes, for the Expence of his Journey to the Court of Spain ; and his Appointments are fettled at Five Thoufand Crowns a Month. Advice being come, that the Fleet which failed from hence in February laft for the Rio de Janeiro, arrived fafely there on the 1 sth of April, and would be ready to return to Portugal in the June following, the Victoria a Sixty Gun Ship has been fitted out, and will fail from hence To-morrow, in order to cruize as far as the Weftern Illands, and there wait the Arrival of the faid Fleet, and ftrengthen their Convoy.

Paris, Sept. 28. On the 22d Inftane the King went into Mourning for the Death of Prince Maximilian of Hanover; which had been notified to his Majefty by his Excellency - Mr. Walpole the Britifh Ambaffadour. The King has been fome Days at Fontainebleau, and the Queen retting out from Verfailles the 2 乡th Inftant, arrived the next Day at Fontainebleau; having lain one Night at Petit-Bourgs a Seat of the Duke d'Antin's. His Majefty having made the Marthal Duke de Tallard, and the Marfhal d'Huxelles, Councellours, they both rook their Places in the Côuncil of State on the 2gth Inftant. On the 22d the Marfhal d'Eftrés fet out from hence, in order to prefide in the Affembly: of the States of Britany. The General Affembly of the Clergy of France was opened here the 25 th, in the Church of the Convent of the Aut guftines.
