OR these three Weeks past Workmen have been continually employed in building new Stables at the Royal Palace for about 200 Horses: And an Apartment is fitting up with the fame Expedition, as it is faid, for the Prince of Brazil; whole Houshold it is thought will be appointed by his Portuguele Majesty before the Marquess de Ios Balbases arrives from Spain.
