N the 12th Inftant a fecret Committee was chosen, out of the feveral Orders of the Nobility, Clergy, and Burghers, (the Peasants having no Part in that Election;) and the Persons chosen into that Committee are known to be zealous in the true Interest of this Kingdom. Baron Sparre with his Lady arrived here Yesterday from England.

From on Board His Majefly's . Sbip the Torbay in the Bay of Revel, Sept. 9. Sir Charles Wager, with the Squadron under his Command which remains in a good Condition, continues here. Yefferday a Ship that has been all this Summer at Petersbourg and Cronflot, paffed by us in her Way to Copenhagen: The Mafter gave Intelligence, That all the Ruffian Gallies at Petersbourg and Cronflot, are already hawled up into their Winter Harbours. That the Ruffian Fleet of Men of War lies at Cronflot, as they have done all the Summer; but that all the Provisions they had on board are expended. That they were ordered to take in Provisions for five Days, and fo to continue, till the British and Danish Squadrons shall have failed from off Revel; and upon Notice of their Departure, to hawl their Ships into the Harbour.

Hague, Off. 4, N.S. The States of the Province of Utrecht having affembled on Monday laft, the City of Utrecht gave its Confent, in Conjunction with the other two Members of that Province (who had declared their Willingnefs before) to the Acceflion of this State to the Treaty of Hanover; fo that the faid Acceffion is now become the unanimous Act of all the Provinces of this Republick.
