THE Count de Haro, a Grandee of Spain and Heir to the late Constable of Castile, arrived here some Days ago from Vienna, in order to take Possession of an Estate which by Virtue of the Peace between the Emperour and Spain is restored to him, he being one of those who followed the Emperour's Party in the late War. The 23d Instant being the Birth-Day of the Prince of Asturias, who then entred into his 13th Year (by which according to the Custom of Spain he is come of Age) most of the Grandees and Nobility went to St. Ildefonso, to compliment their Catholick Majesties and the Prince, and to kiss their Hands. On the 26th Prince Sherbatoff the Muscovire Minister returned hither from St. Ildefonso, where he had several Conferences with Count Konigseck and the Marquess de la Paz. Count Vander Nat, a Nobleman of Holstein, is expected here very soon, with the Title of Minister from the Duke of Holstein. His Catholick Majesty has declared, that on the 15th of next Month he will leave St. Ildefonso, to go to reside for some Weeks at the Escorial. Yesterday a Courier arrived at St. Ildefonso from Cadiz, with an Account that on the 25th Instant an Advice-Boat put in there from the West-Indies; bringing Notice that the Flota from Vera Cruz was come to the Havana. Last Night his Catholick Majesty dismissed the Marquess de Grimaldo, leaving him the Salary of Secretary, which is Two Thousand Pistoles a Year, and ordering him to retire to this City, which he has done to Day. At the same Time his Catholick Majesty wrote a Note to his Confessour, Father Bermudes a Jesuit, signifying that his Majesty having no further Occasion for his Service, had thought fit to direct him to go to the Jesuits College here, which accordingly he has done to Day. The said Father had confessed his Majesty but five Hours before the said Note was delivered to him. The Affairs of the Marquess de Grimaldo's Office, viz. those of Italy and Portugal, are joynd to those of the Marquess de la Paz, who is now the sole Secretary for all Foreign Affairs: And the Employment of Secretary for the Finances, which the latter had, is given to Don Joseph Patinno, who keeps also his Office of Secretary of Marise and the Indies, and has likewise been appointed President and Super-Intendant of the Finances in the Room of Don Francisco Arriaga, who is made one of the Counsellours of the Camara of Castile. Count Konigseck's Coaches and Equipages, which are to serve for the Entry that Ambassadour is to make when the Court returns hither, are arrived. It has been very much remarked, that the said Equipage was conducted all the Way hither, and entred Madrid with the Imperial Colours upon it. The Duke of Wharton having received from Court Part of his Lady's Portion, has given Entertainments and Balls at Caramanchel; and talks of setting out for Rome, as soon as he

shall have received the rest of the said Portion. The late Duke of Ormond, and the late Earl Marishal, are at St. Ildefonso. Letters from St. Andero of the 15th Instant relate, that the Day before the two Spanish Men of War the St. Philip and St. Charles of 60 Guns each, sailed from that Port to the West-Indies, having on board 600 Soldiers.
