## Lisbon, October 14, N. S.

ON the 2gth paft Sir John Jennings came in here, and on the roth Inftant failed for England with five Men of War. The fame Day Rear Admiral Hopfon on board the Sterling Cafle, with the York, failed to the Southward; Captain Stewart who was left off Lagos being to joyn him with the remaining Part of the Squadron. During the whole Time the Britifh Men of War were here, fuch exa\&t Difcipline was kept, that not the leaft Diforder happened: And great Civility and Readinels was Ghewn here in fupplying the Britilh Squadron with every thing they wanted. On the 3d Inftant arrived here in 82 Days, the Fleet from the Rio de Janeiro; confirting of 13 Merchant Ships under the Convoy of two Men of War: They are laden with Timber, Hides, and Sugar, and have brought Three Millions of Crufados for the King, and Eight for private Perfons. The Account of the Richnefs of the new Mines is confirmed. A Portuguefe having fraudulently gone off to the Brafils wirh fome of the Britifh Merchants Goods, in February laft, Brigadier Dormer His Britannick Majefy's Envoy here made Application to the Court, and procured an Order from his Portuguefe Majefty to the Governour of the Rio de Janeiro; purfuant to whith the faid Goods were fecured and delivered up to the Agents of thofe Merchants in the Brafils, as chey have fent them Advice; and the Perfon himfelf is now returned. Yeferday a publick Auto da Fé was held in this City: In which 39 Men and 32 Women were tried for various Offences. Two Men and one Woman were fentenced to be burne. One of the Men, nathed Antonio Dias Fernandes a Merchant of this City convitted of Judaifo, was pardoned on his Recantation. The brher, being a Prieft named Manoel Lapes de Carvalho, a Native of the Bahia, 44 Years old, was executed at Four a.Clock this Morning, being burned alive. He obftinately perfifted in his Opinion,* which was, that Chrift came not to
deffroy the Law of Mofes, but to perfet it and that Circumcifion was as néceffary- as Bap: tifm. At the Place of Execution he was told it was not yer too late for Mercy if he would - renounce his Errors, and own the Do\&trines of the Inquifition ; but this he abfolutely refufed, faying the Inquifition were not Chriftians buc Idolaters. He fuffered with great Refolution, amidft the Flames calling upon the God of Ifrael. The Woman, of 65 Years of Age, convitted a fecond Time of Judaical Practices, was ftrangled and afterwards burnt. On the sth Inftane Vice Admiral Somelfyk and Rear Admiral van Coperen arrived here with four Dutch Men of War. This Day two more Dutch Men of War are come in from Cadiz, the Commanders of which fay they were ordered to leave that Port in 24 Hours. His Britannick Majeft's Ship the Durfey Galley is here; and this Day came in the Lyme, Lord Vere Commander.

Hague, Norv. 5, N.S. This Day the States of the Province of Holland paffed a Refolution unanimoufly, to confent to the Augmentation of the Forces of this Republick, in the Manner propofed by the Council of State.
