Notwithstanding it was given out upon the Muscovite Ambasfadour's first coming hither, that he defigned forthwith to press for his Audiences at Court, yet he has not bitherto fo much as notified his Arrival, either to the President of the Chancery, or to any of the foreign Ministers; though he has passed fome Hours every Day with Count Freytag the Imperial Minister. In the mean time, the faid Muscovite Ambasfadour has bought of the Countess Dowager Sparre, for 5000 Rixdollars, a very fine Coach made at Paris when the late Senatour her Husband was Ambassatiadour in France about fix Years ago.

Hague, Dec. 13, N. S. The States of Holland were affembled Yefterday till Five of the Clock in the Afternoon, and being all unanimoufly difpofed for the propofed fecond Augmentation of Troops and the other Particulars contained in the laft Petition of the Council of State, 'tis reckoned that this Affair is as good as concluded.
