Yesterday sayled the Dover, Captain Berry Commander, for Algiers, from whence he intends for England. The Scipio is arrived from Genoua, for which place the Sparke is gone from hence.

Berlin, Feb. 16. Her Electoral Highness having been brought to Bed of a young Prince, yesterday was performed the Ceremony of Christoing him by the Name of Albertus Fredericus. The Electoral Prince, our Electors eldest Son, being come to the 18 year of his age, hath for the first time taken his place in the Councel, where his Electoral Highness will have him constantly present, for the better informing him with the state of affairs. Que Elector gives out Commissions daily for the raising of Men, intending, as is said, to have this Spring, a good Army on foot.

matter deferred till some other more seasonable
time, which at the desire of the King, and the interposition of the Senate, they accordingly resolved
it should, and that this Session they would enter upon no other business, but that for the raising of Men and Money for the security of the
Kingdom.

Here hath been this week a report in Town, that the greatest part of the Polish Army growing daily more and more discontented by reason of the want of their arrears, and the many hardships they suffer in their winter quarters, had confederated against the Crown, having made choice of one Samosh for their General, a person who is known to be highly dissatisfied with the present Government, because as he pretends, he hath not been able to obtain any satisfaction in his pretence upon the Town of Samosh, which is now in the possession of the Kings Mother, as of right belonging to her; but it is hoped, that this is onely a report, and that the Dyet now assembled, will take speedy care for the satisfying the Army,

to prevent such disorders.

The Roads about Warfaw have been lately very much infested by some Polish Gentlemen, who have committed several Murthers and Robberies, two of the chiesest of them have been taken Prisoners, and according to the Sentence of the Dyet, beheaded at Warfaw, which it is hoped, may discourage the others from continuing in those bad courses.

Hague, Feb. 25. Bruffels, Feb. 16.
