*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

**T**HE inexpressible Felicity the British Dominions have enjoyed ever since your Majesty's happy Accession to the Throne, by your securing to your People in the most perfect Manner all their Rights Civil and Religious, and your Sollicitude to make them easy in every Respect to the utmost of your Power, demands the continual Acknowledgments of your faithful Subjects: But particularly, when Designs are forming to dethrone your Majesty, and to overturn our Excellent Constitution, your dutiful People cannot forbear, upon such an Occasion, to express the Sense they have of their Obligations to your Majesty, for your great Justice and Goodness to them;

and to shew to the World that they set a true Value upon the State they are in.

The Encroachments upon the Trade of this Kingdom against solemn Treaties and Stipulations to the contrary; the haughty Demands for your delivering up your Dominions in Spain; and the Project for placing the Pretender upon your Throne, are Injuries and Indignities that the British Nation will never bear. We are not at all intimidated by the Menaces of our Enemies, but are so sanguine that we doubt not but by God's Blessing, and the prudent Care of your Majesty in entering into powerful Alliances, and the formidable Force you are preparing upon this Occasion, the Designs of the Disturbers of the Peace of Europe will be entirely disappointed.

Your People would be void of all Duty and Gratitude, if they should not be anxious to preserve the best of Kings and the best of Governments. We are so sensible of our Happiness in this Respect, that we shall be always ready cheerfully to contribute whatever is dear and valuable to us, in the Support of both.

That your Majesty's Reign over us may be long, happy and glorious; that you may be the great Instrument of preserving the Peace of Europe; and always the successful Upholder of the Protestant Interest, is the hearty Wish of,

*Stockholm, Jan. 17, O. S.* The King of Sweden has caused the following Placard to be published, allowing the Importation of Corn Custom-free.

**F**rederick by the Grace of God King of the Swedes Goths and Vandals, &c. Be it known, That whereas we have to our great Grief been informed, that not only last Year, but especially this present Year, there has been a deplorable Scarcity of Corn, as well in the great Dutchy of Finland, as in several of the Provinces of the Kingdom: We, out of a particular Care and Concern for the Good and Welfare of our loving Subjects, being willing and disposed to make use of all such Means as may tend, under this present common Want, to the Relief of the poor Sufferers, and likewise to prevent all such ill Consequences as might otherwise ensue, have, for obtaining so good an End, thought fit, among our other gracious Cares, by this our publick Placard, to ordain, that all Corn, consisting of Rye, Barley, and Oats, which shall be imported from Abroad, from what Country soever, (and even without any Difference if the same be brought from our own or foreign Ports, either by Sea, or cross the Frontiers, from one to another Sea Port, or Frontier-Custom House,) shall from the Beginning of the Year 1727, to the last of May the same Year, be free and exempt from paying the great Custom. Pursuant to which, all whom it may concern are to regulate themselves. In Confirmation whereof, we have signed this with our own Hand, and caused our Royal Seal to be affixed thereto. Given at Stockholm in the Council-Chamber the 13th of December, 1726.

*Lisbon, Feb. 5, N. S.* The 17th past arrived here the Pernambuco Fleet, consisting of 16 Sail of Merchant Ships, under the Convoy of one Man of War; their Cargoes are chiefly Hides, Sugar, and Brazil Wood, besides Money. The 24th past his Portuguese Majesty was pleased to nominate Dom Duarte Sodré Perreira Lord of Aguas Bellas, to be Governour of Pernambuco and Captain General of that Province. The 29th past died in the 89th Year of his Age, Dom Nuno Alvez Perreira de Mello, first Duke of Cadaval, fourth Marquess of Ferreira, fifth Conde of Tentugal, one of his Majesty's Councillours of State

and War, President of the Tribunal of the Dezembargo de Paço, Master of the Household to three Queens of Portugal, Lieutenant-General of the Army next to the Person of his Portuguese Majesty, and General of the Horse in the Province of Estremadura. He was endowed with many extraordinary Qualities, and had the Character of administering Justice very strictly.
