**T**HE following humble Address of the Bayliff and Capital Burgeses of the Borough of Leominster, in their Council Chamber assembled the 4th of February 1726, has been presented to His Majesty by Sir Archer Croft, Baronet, and Sir George Caswall, their Representatives in Parliament, introduced by the Right Honourable Sir Robert Walpole Chancellor of the Exchequer. Which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Address of the Bayliff and Capital Burgeses of the Borough of Leominster, in the Council Chamber assembled, the 4th Day of February 1726.

*Most Gracious Sovereign,*

**M**AY it please your Majesty to accept our most humble and unfeigned Thanks for the many repeated Instances of your paternal Goodness to us, with the rest of your People, from the Time of your Majesty's happy Accession to the Throne:

Your loyal Subjects are in an especial Manner bound at this Juncture, to offer to your Majesty our most thankful Acknowledgements for your tender Regard to our Safety, in vouchsafing us such early Notice of the malevolent and dangerous Designs which have been formed against us by the Emperour and King of Spain.

The Projects of those Princes, (which have been so timely penetrated by your Majesty's vigilant Sagacity, and so kindly laid open to your People) we apprehend are gross Infractions of solemn Treaties, and big with a Ruin which threatens not only the Rights and Liberties of all your Subjects, but the Peace and Repose of all Europe; and as

such, cannot fail of exciting the same Indignation in the Breast of every true Briton, which we beg Leave to assure your Majesty, the Inhabitants of this your ancient and loyal Borough have already conceived.

We humbly beg Leave on this important Occasion, to give in our repeated Assurances, that we account our own Safety inseparably united with that of your Majesty's Person and Government; and that if an Invasion should be attempted in Prejudice of either, we shall be ready to exert ourselves for Conviction of our Enemies, that they have miscalculated the Strength and Courage, the Virtue and Loyalty of the People of Great Britain.

May it please God to continue prospering your unwearied Endeavours to promote the publick Welfare, and to permit the Balance of Europe to be still held by your Majesty, that foreign Nations may be Sharers with your own People in the Felicities of your Government, and with us bless the Hand which is so ready to distribute impartial Justice to Mankind.

*Madrid, Feb. 3, N. S.* The Duke of Liria, who is to go to Muscovy as Ambassador from this Court, has already received half of the 18000 Pistoles granted him for the Expence of his Journey; and as soon as he shall have received the Remainder, he will set out for that Country by the Way of Italy and Vienna. The Marquess de los Balbases, who 14 Months ago was appointed Ambassador from his Catholick Majesty to the King of Portugal, for demanding the Infanta of Portugal for the Prince of Asturias, has as yet received no Order to repair thither; nor is the Marquess de Abrantes who has been named Ambassador from the King of Portugal to this Court, to demand the Infanta of Spain for the Prince of Brazil, expected here soon; and some Persons of his Retinue, who arrived here some Months

Months ago, are returned to Lisbon; which Delays, as is assured, proceed from the great Difficulties started between the two Courts in some Matters of Importance. On the 31st past their Catholick Majesties came from the Pardo to the Palace here, and according to Custom celebrated in the Palace Chapel Candlemas-Day, which was Yesterday, and in the Afternoon went to pay their Devotions to the Holy Virgin of Atocha; from whence they returned to the Pardo, where they will reside some few Weeks longer. Count Conigseck, the Emperor's Minister here has been some time laid up with the Gout; he was visited on Saturday last by the Marquis de la Paz, who was come hither with their Catholick Majesties, and returned with them Yesterday to the Pardo. Some Days ago this Court dispatched a Courier to the Count de las Torres, ordering him to carry on with all possible Speed his Preparations for making the Siege of Gibraltar; and to open the Trenches before that Place so soon as the Artillery shall be arrived; notwithstanding the strong Representations signed by all the General Officers (except the said Count de las Torres) in a Council of War held on the 16th past, and sent up to his Catholick Majesty, setting forth the Impossibility of taking that Place by the Land Side, and that the attacking of it on the Sea Side was become as impracticable, since the Arrival of Admiral Hopson with the British Squadron. Letters from the Spanish Camp of the 25th past relate, that the Brass Artillery still lay upon the Road from Cadiz, because of the great Rains; and that the General himself was gone to find Means to bring it up to the Camp; but that 40 Pieces of Iron Cannon, with other warlike Materials, were arrived at Algezira in small Vessels from Cadiz, under the Convoy of three Gallies, without having been disturbed by the British Men of War in the Bay. Letters from Cadiz of the 28th past advise, that that Garrison is left almost Defenceless, all the heavy Artillery having been removed towards the Camp, so that they have been obliged to mount upon the Ramparts a few old Iron Cannon, from Nine to Twelve Pounders; that the Place is also very thin of Men, four Battalions being gone to Ceuta and others to the said Camp; that the Advice Boat having received the last Dispatches from Court, sailed on the 23d past for the Havana, and from thence for Cartagena; and that 50 small Vessels were lading more Iron Artillery and Military Stores for

Algezira. Letters from Malaga of the 28th past relate, that the Commanding Officer there, in pursuance of Orders from the Count de las Torres, had seized all small Vessels, hiring them by the Month, and was sending them to Algezira, in order, as was given out, to transport Fascines to the Camp; that a Decree had been published, prohibiting on Pain of Death, all manner of Communication and Correspondence with Gibraltar, and the carrying thither any kind of Provision; and that another Decree had been published, permitting the transporting of all sorts of Provisions by Sea to the Camp (which before had been prohibited) and that there, as well as what went by Land for the said Camp, the same should pay no Duties.
