be employed in the Siege of Gibraltar; that three Men of War, one of 70 and two of 50 Guns each, were expected there from St. Andero; and that the Communication with Gibraltar was intirely cut off. Letters of the 2d Inftant from the Spanish Camp at Gibraltar advise, that all the Troops are encamped in Form within half a League of that Place; that fome Artillery from Cadiz by Land was arrived, and that the reft was expected in a few Days; after the Arrival of which the Orders would be given by the General for opening the Trenches; that there is a great Defertion among the Spanish Troops, which has diminished a confiderable Part of their Army; but that the Governour of Eibraltar had not yet admitted into the Town any of those Deserters; that the faid Troops luffer very much from the rainy Weather and Cold, and for want of Money and other Necessaries; and that a Battery of fome Iron Cannon has been erected in the Ifland near Algezira, to protect upon that Side of the Bay the fmall Veffels and Boats which bring the Provisions and Stores.

St. James's, February 17. On the 14th Instant his Excellency Ma-homet Ben Ali Abogli, Ambassadour from the Emperour of Morocco, had a private Audience of Leave of His Majesty, to which he was introduced by his Grace the Duke of Newcaitle one of His Majefty's Principal Se-cretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Kt.
