May it please your Majesty; W E your most dutiful Subjects, the Lord Lieutenant, the High-Sheriff, Grand-Jury, Deputy-Lieutenants, Knights of the Shire, Juffices of the Peace, Clergy, Gentlemen and Principal Inhabitants of the County of Hertford, humbly beg Leave to express to your Majefty our great Surprize and Concern to behold the Tranquility (which this Nation, with the reft of Europe, ebjoyed; and which, by the Juffice and Be-pignity of your Majefue amaions Diffecti nignity of your Majesty's gracious Dispositi-on, seemed to be secured to your People) dis-turbed by Designs equally Unjust and Chi-merical; and the Important Fortress of Gibraltar (conquered by the victorious Arms of her late Majefty, and confirmed to us by the moft folemn Treaties) actually invefted by the King of Spain.

Whatever the Enemies to our Peace may conceive from the intriguing Schemes of their felfifh enterprizing Politicians, we doubt not but that good Province, which fo fignal-ly protects your Majefty and thefe King-doms, will abate their Pride and confound their Devices. In the mean Time give us Leave to affure your Majefty that your loval Leave to allure your Majesty, that your loyal
