Care and fuccessful Endeavours in the advancing the Honour, and promoting the Inte-rest of this Kingdom. As this your Maje-fty's great Care of your People hath filled their Hearts with Gratitude, so hath it raised in fome foreign Powers a Spirit of Envy and Contention, infomuch that without the least Colour of Juffice, at a great Expence of Men and Money, (and we hope in the End to their Confulion and Dilappointment) they have attempted to force from your Majefty a Part of your Dominions, and are endcavouring to ruin the Commerce of the whole : Not content with these Injuries already offered to your Majesty and the Kingdom, they have allo projected to impose on us the Pretender, whom we have abjured, and whom we are bound for ever to oppose, as we tender our Religious and Civil Rights. These Proceedings and Projects of the Powers confederated against your Majesty, make it seasonable for your Subjects to declare their unalterable Refolutions to defend your Majesty against all your Enemies whatsoever ; which Resolution on our Parts, we defire to affure your Majesty we shall be always ready to execute to the utmost of our Power, being obliged thereto by our Oaths, our Interest, and our Gratitude. In Testimony whereof, we have caufed the common Seal of the laid City to be hereunto

affixed, this 11th Day of April, in the 13th Year of your Majesty's most glorious Reign.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

YOUR Majefty's early Care to prevent the fecret Machinations and Deligns of our Enemies Abroad, not only to ruin our Trade, but even to deprive us of our Religion, Liberties, and every Thing elfe that is most dear to a free People, is fo apparent to all your Subjects, that even we who live in the Marches of Wales, a remote Part of your Majesty's Dominions, cannot be ignorant thereof, nor fuffer ourfelves to be wanting in our Duty to make our most humble and grateful Acknowledgmer to your Majesty, for the fame, and to declare our Abhorrence and Deteftation of the Indignity lately offer-ed to your Majefty and the British Nation by the Refident of the Emperour of Germany, whole pretended Gratitude, Affection and Efteem for this Nation, had been best manifefted, as our Reprefentatives have declared, by doing Honour to the King whom the People honour, and Juffice to the People whole Rights are now invaded by his Allies, and defended by the best of Princes, even with the Hazard of his own Dominions in Germany.

But it is our Happiness that the powerful Forces of Spain, Rulfia, and Germany, lye at fo great a Diftance from one another, that your Majesty, with the Fleet of Great Britain, is able to hinder their Conjunction; and that your Majesty's Experience, Wildom, and Forelight is such, that in cale any of your Ministers, under the specious Pretence of Frugality, should have advised your Majesty to have fuffered the Russians to distress the Northern Princes, whereby they might have been obliged, for their own Safety, to give Liberty to the Ruffian Fleet to pais the Sound, and to have free Accels to the Ports opposite to North-Britain, your Majesty would have been so far from being misled by such evil Counfel, that on the contrary you would have looked upon fuch Counfellours as Betrayers of the true Interest of your Majesty and your People.

There are none of your Majesty's Subjects that have read the British History, can for-get how often Forces from the Northern Ports have formerly been transported into this Island with Success; and there are none that know the Situation thereof, but must be fenfible how eafy it will be at any Time to follow the fame Example, if not prevented by the Fleet of Great Britain; neither can it be believed, that Spain would begin a War with this Nation, if there were not Defigns carrying on of the greatest Danger to us, and to the Tranquility of all Europe : How then can we fufficiently acknowledge the great Providence of God in placing your Majefly on the Britifh Throne, and infpiring into your Thoughts a Refolution of fending your Fleet Abroad in due Time into the Baltick, West-Indies,
