Country Habitations, and retire thither themselves. We are told of a Bridge of Boats his Excellency has ordered to be made over the Schelde at Am werp, for the passage of Troops, Ge.

Bruffels, Ditto 18. To morrow his Excellency the Count de Monterey intends to go to Louvain, and may, as is faid, from thence pafs to Lecuwe, to fee in what forwardnels the Cittade, there is, his Excellency will within few days, as we are told, appoint a Rendevous of fix or feven thoufand Men, which he refolves to keep in a Body near this City, for the greater fecurity of it, befides the Succors we expect from the United Provinces.

The three Regiments which are raifing in Germany for the Service of these Countries, are faid to be almost compleat, and may be very suddainly in a posture to begin their march hither. One of the Dutch Deputies are returned to the Hague, though Monsseur de Witt continues still here, and hath often Constructs with the Principal Ministers at this Court.

From Luxemburgh they write, that the French pais daily in great numbers near those Frontiers, on their march towards the Electorate of Cologne. We fuddainly expect here the Prince of Vaudemont with the Regiment of Foot under his Command.

Maestricht, March 15. From Namur they write, that by order from his Excellency the Count de Monterey, Governor of the Spanish Neatherlands, all Vessel Jaden with Corne; Ammunition, or other Military provisions going down the Meuse, for Liege, had been stopt there; the fame directions having been sent to all other Places, not to let any Vessels or Wagons laden as aforesaid, to pass towards that Bishoprick, where the French have created their Magazines, and have already bought up great quantities of Corn; the States Genera have, as is said, at the same time, fent orders to the Governor of Venso, that he take the same care there. All possible diligence is used by our Governor, for the putting this place into a good posture of defence.

Cologne, March 15, We begin here to be at prefent fomewhat concerned at the abundance of Forreign Forces being quartered round about us, and especially, fince our Treaty lately concluded with our Elector, feems not as yet to be in its full force, through the delay of the Emperors Ratification of it, which as well his Electoral Highness, as our Magistrates, have by their Deputies at the Court at Vienna, very earnessly prefed.

The Bifhop of Strasburgh, together with Prince Willem of Furftenburgh, and the Duke of Luxémburgh, having been feveral days here, are gone again for Bon. Great diligence is used at Nuis, for the making a Cittadel there, on which they work with fo many hands, that it is thought, it may be finished in fome Months. The Prince of Vaudemont continues very aftive for the compleating the Regiment of Foot he is raising in these parts, for the fervice of the Spanish Neatherlands. We hear nothing farther of the Duke of Lorraine's accommodation with his most Christian Majesty.

Hague, March 15. The 13 inftant the States of Holland and West-Friesland were affembled, when they refumed the debate of several matters, before them; the same day the Councel of State, amongst whom was likewise his Highness the Prince of Grange, was in the Affembly of the said States, to

whom they reported feveral things relating to the prefent Conjuncture. The Prince of Oranges Equippage for this Campague, is preparing, with great diligence, and will, as is faid, be very rich and noble, his Highnefs is, as we are told, to have the nomination of the Officers for the Regiment of Horfe now to be raifed, of which, the two first Troops are more particularly defigned for his Highnefs's Life Guard, and are accordingly to be clothed in his Livery.

Here are daily conferences between the Deputies of the Councel of State, and feveral of the Principal Officers, as well of the Army as the Fleet, concerning our Military Preparations; it is faid, that the Officers imployed in our new Leavies, have fent to acquaint the States, that heir Companies are almost compleat, and that they may be very fuddainly in a pofture to make with them to the place of Rendevous.

Major General Spæn, andsthe Heer Romswinckell, Envoyes from his Electoral' Highnels of Brandesburgh, having difpatched their affairs here, thisy in a day or two departs for Cleve, who prefent in the Affambly of the States of rhole Countries, who are now met there. The Heer d'Amerongen continues fill at Berlin.

Dires, 18. The ry inflant drrived here the Troop of Horfe under the Command of the Herr Vander Leegue, and will vice we orders here, how to proceed farther. The Count de Dhond, hiving finally concluded his agreement with the States, for the raising 3500 Swiffes for their Service, he is accordingly gone for Berne, in order to the beeginning his Leavies.

ginning his Leavies. The Lieutenant 'Admiral de Ruytor', together with the Deputies of the respective Admiralties, arrived here yesterday; and have fince been in the Affembly of the Councel of State, to give them an account of what forwardness the Fleet is at prefent in. The States having finally made choice of the Heer of Werchendam, to go their 'Ambaffador Extraordinary to the Crown of Danemark, and ordered him to depart on his journey thither, fo foon as may be, for that their affairs feem to require his speedy presence at that Court ; it is faid ] his Excellency intends to go hence on Munday next, and to take his paffage by Land. The two Companies of Foot under the Command of Colonel Beaumont, and Lieutenant Colonel Buys, are ordered to march forthwith to Bergen op Zoom, to continue in Garrison there.

From Parie we hear not as yet, that our Ambaffador had taken his leave of his Majefty, though he had been called upon fo to do, expecting, as is faid, to receive first farther orders from hence; the preparations for War in that Kingdom are very great, and carried on with much wigor. The Bishop of Munfter continues to raile Men apace.

Park, March 19. The Heer de Groot Ambaffador from the States General of the United Provinces, continues still here, by reason of some indisposition that hath hitherto bindred him from taking his leave of his Majesty, which it is said, he will do on Monday or Tuesday next, in order to his return home.

Yefterday was held an Extraordinary Councel for War, where his Majefty made choice of the principal Officers to ferve in his Armies this Summer. The Sieur Canon is at prefent here, on the part of the Duke of Lorraine, and as is faid, is Treating with these Ministers, concerning an accommodation between this Crown, and the faid Duke his Master.
