A'T the Court at Leicester-House, the 15th Day of June 1727.

PRESENT.

The King's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by the late Act of Uniformity, which establisheth the Liturgy, and Enacts, That no Form or Order of Common Prayers be openly used, other than what is pre-fcribed and appointed to be used in and by the faid Book; it is notwithstanding provided, that in all those Prayers, Litanies, and Collects, which do any wife relate to the King, Queen, or Royal Progeny, the Names be altered and changed, from Time to Time, and fitted to the prefent Occafion, according to Direction of lawful Authority: His Majefty was pleafed this Day in Council to declare his Royal Will and Pleafure, that in all the Prayers, Litanies, and Collects for the Royal Family, inftead of the Words [His Royal Highnefs George Prince of Wales, the Prin-cefs, and their Iffue, and all the Royal Fa-mily] be inferted [Our Gracious Queen Ca-roline, the Royal Iffue, and the Reft of the Royal Family And His And High Royal Family.] And His Majefty doth ftrict-ly Charge and Command, that no Edition of the Common Prayer be from henceforth printed, but with this Amendment; and that in the mean Time, till Copies of fuch Edition may be had, all Parfons, Vicars, and Curates within this Realm do (for the preventing of Mistakes) with the Pen correct and amend all such Prayers in their Church Books, according to the aforegoing Direction : And for the better Notice hereof, that this Order be forthwith printed and published, and fent to the feveral Parishes; and that the Right Re-verend the Bishops do take Care that Obe-dience be paid to the same accordingly.

A PROCLAMATION,

W Hereas at the Time of the Demife of our late Royal Father, of Glorious Me-mory, this prefent Parliament stood pro-gued to Tuesday the Twenty Seventh Day of this Instant June; and whereas by virtue of an Act of Parliament made in the Sixth Year of the Reign of our late Royal Pre-decessfor Queen Anne, of Blessed Memory, Entituled, An Act for the Security of Her Majesty's Person and Government, and of the Succession of the Crown of Great Britain in the Protestant Line, it is required that the the Protestant Line, it is required that the faid Parliament should immediately after such Demife, Meet, Convene, and Sit, and should Act, notwithstanding such Demise, for and during the Term of Six Months, and no lon-ger, unless the same should be sooner proro-gued or disolved, as in the said Act is proviguea or allowea, as in the fait Act is provi-ded; and whereas we, with the Advice of our Privy Council, did order that our faid Parliament should be prorogued to Tucsday the Twenty Seventh Day of this Instant June, and the same bath been prorogued ac-cordingly : Now we do hereby, with the Ad-vice of our Privy Council, declare our Royal Will and Pleasure. That the said Parliament Will and Pleasure, That the faid Parliament Will and Fleagure, That the faid Farliament [hall, on Tuesday the Twenty Seventh Day of this Instant June, be held, and Sit for the Dispatch of divers Weighty and Impor-tant Affairs; and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgess, and the Commissioners of Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and tommanded to give their Attendance argoring to at Wostminster on Tuesd Attendance accordingly at Westminster, on Tuesday the Twenty Seventh Day of this Instant fune.
