N Express having brought the News of the Decease of our late Sovereign Lord King George, of bleffed Memory, the High and Mighty Prince, George Prince of Wales, was this Day pro-claimed, with the usual Formalities, at the Market-Cross of this City, at the Gates of the Castle, and at the Abby of Holy-Rood-House King of Great Britain Empres and House, King of Great Britain, France and Ireland; at which Ceremony affifted a great many of the Nobility and Gentry of this Country who were then in Town.

WHereas it hath pleased Almighty God to call to His Mercy our late Sovereign Lord King George, of Blessed Memory, by whose Decease the Imperial Crowns of Great-Britain, France and Ireland, are solely and rightfully come to the High and Mighty Prince, George Prince of Wales: And whereas the Lords Spiritual and Temporal of this Realm, assisted with those of His late Majesty's Privy-Council, with Numbers of other principal Gentlemen of Quality, with Majesty's Privy Council, with Numbers of other principal Gentlemen of Quality, with the Lord Mayer, Aldermen, and Citizens of London, did, by a Proclamation given at the Court of Leicester-House, the Fourteenth Day of June Instant, publish and proclaim, That the High and Mighty Prince, George Prince of Wales, is now, by the Death of our late Sovercign, of happy Memory, beceme our only lawful and rightful Liege Lord, George the Second, by the Grace of God, King of Great Britain, France and Ireland, Defender of the Faith, &c. And whereas, in Obedience to an Order of the whereas, in Obedience to an Order of the Lords of His Majesty's most Honourable Privy-Council, a Copy of the said Proclamation has been sent to the Lord Provost of Edinburgh, in order to Proclaim His Royal Ma-jesty: Therefore, the Lord Provost, Magi-strates and Town-Council of Edinburgh, as-sisted with Numbers of Noblemen and other principal Gentlemen of Quality, do now hereby, with one full Voice and Consent of Tonous and Heart. Publish and Proclaim, Tongue and Heart, Publish and Proclaim,

That the High and Mighty Prince, George Prince of Wales, is now, by the Death of our late Sovereign of happy Memory, become our only lawful and rightful Liege Lord George the Second, by the Grace of God, King of Great Brituin, France und Ireland, Defender of the Faith, Sc. to whom we do acknowledge all Faith and confant Obedience, with all hearty and humble Affection; befeeching God, by whom Kings and Queens do reign, to blest the Royal King George the Second, with long and happy Years to reign over us. Given at Edinburgh, the Nineteenth Day of June, 1727.
