Van der Meer, wrote a Letter to the Earl of Portmore, acquainting him that he had had an Account from Mr. Walpole His Majesty's Ambassadour, of the signing of the said Articles.

Refolved, 'That the Annuities after the Rate of Four Pounds per Cent. per Annum, payable for or on the feveral flanding Orders made or to be made, for or in respect of the several Army Debentures certified since the 21st Day of March 1719, and charged on the General Fund, pursuant to the several Acts of Parliament for that Purpose, be redeemed and paid off.
