Whitehall, June 24.

Letters from Madrid of the 20th of June, N. S. advise, that the King of Spain having received from Paris an Account of the signing of the Preliminary Articles for a general Pacification the 31st of May, had ordered the Marquês de la Paz, his Secretary of State, to dispatch a Courier to the Count de las Torres, to command him to forbear all further Hostilities against Gibraltar: And by the same Courier the Dutch Minister at Madrid M. Van der Meer, wrote a Letter to the Earl of Portmore, acquainting him that he had had an Account from Mr. Walpole His Majesty's Ambassador, of the signing of the said Articles.

This Day the following Signification in Writing under the Hand of the Right Honourable Sir Spencer Compton, Knight of the most Honourable Order of the Bath and Speaker of the Honourable House of Commons, was affixed upon the Royal Exchange

in London, which is also directed to be inserted in the London Gazette by the several Acts of Parliament for that Purpose. viz.

Pursuant to an Order of the Honourable House of Commons made the Seventh Day of March 1726, I do hereby signify, that the said House of Commons did on the said Seventh Day of March 1726, come to the following Resolution, viz.

Resolved, That the Annuities after the Rate of Four Pounds per Cent. per Annum, payable for or on the several funding Orders made or to be made, for or in respect of the several Army Debentures certified since the 21st Day of March 1719, and charged on the General Fund, pursuant to the several Acts of Parliament for that Purpose, be redeemed and paid off.

Given under my Hand this 24th Day of June, 1727.

Another Anonymous Letter directed to the Chancellor of the Exchequer, with a Bank Note inclosed, desiring that the same might be paid into the Exchequer towards the Discharge of the National Debt, has been received, and the Note apply'd accordingly.

These are, by Order of the Right Honourable the Lords and others Commissioners for the Affairs of the Royal Hospital near Chelsea, to give Notice, That all the Out-Pensioners (as well Letter-Men as others) belonging to the said Hospital residing in London, or within 20 Miles thereof, are required to appear personally at the Secretary's Office in the said Hospital before the 25th of August next, where Attendance will be given on Tuesday and Wednesday, the 27th and 28th of this Instant June, 1727, from Eight a-Clock in the Morning till Two in the Afternoon, as also every Tuesday and Wednesday following till the said 25th of August, in order to register their such Appearance; and that all Out-Pensioners as are at a greater Distance, are required to apply themselves forthwith to one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace in the Neighbourhood where they reside, and make Oath that they are Out-Pensioners belonging to the said Hospital, mentioning in the Certificate the Regiment to which they did formerly belong, how long they serv'd in the Army, their Age, in what manner wounded or disabled, their present Place of Abode, and that they are no otherwise provided for by the Government; to the Intent that the Commissioners for the Affairs of the said Hospital may be satisfied that they are the same Persons that have passed their Examination. 'Tis also required, that the said Certificates be sent by the General Post only, directed to the Right Honourable Sir Spencer Compton, Pay-Master-General of His Majesty's Forces, at the Horse-Guards, London. And 'tis hereby further notified, that no one will be entered on the Pay Book of the said Hospital, or be thought entitled to the said Pension, that shall neglect making their Appearance, or sending Certificates as before directed.
