And we most humbly befeech your Majesty to give us Leave to affirm, that our Refolution of inviolable Duty and Allegiance to your Majeffy, proceeds not only from our Inclina-tion attd the Sitcerity of our Hearts, but allo form a first Bailed at the second second from a firm Belief of its being a Religious Duty, with which no Power upon Earth can difpenfe.
