M. Vander Meer, Ambafladour of the States General at the Court of Madrid, having received the following Letter from the King of Spain's Secretary of State, has transmitted it hither.

SIR,

HAVING laid before the King the In-ftance which your Excellency makes in your Office of the 2d of this Month, in order to know whether there is or is not at prefent a Freedom of Trade with England, fince the Ceflation of Hostilities has been published in Cadiz and at Bilbao, to the Intent that your Excellency may acquaint therewith the British Minister that shall have remained at Paris; his Majesty has been pleased to declare that his Royal Intention is, That English Ships be from this instant admitted freely to Trade on all the Coafts and in all the Ports of Spain, in the fame Manner and with the fame Circumstances as were practifed in Time of Peace; and this his Majesty commands me to acquaint your Excellency with, that you may give Notice thereof where-ever you pleafe, and bear Teftimony of the Franknefs and good Faith with which His Majefty grants and anticipates all poffible Advantages to the British Nation : And your Excellency must be allured, that to accomplish this, the proper Orders shall be immediately given to all the Ports and Places necessary.
