May you long sway the Scepter of a dutiful and loyal People, chearful in their Obedience, and intirely devoted to your Service; of which Number, we your Majesty's Subjects of your King's County in Ireland, solemnly declare ourselves, in full Zeal and Affection to your Majesty's most sacred Person and Government; assuring you, that at all Times we shall give our utmost Opposition to all your Enemies, if such there can be: 'This we have sworn; in this we will persevere.
