N the 5th Inftant Count Konigfegg, the Imperial Minister, notified to the States-General, by Order from the Archdutchels Governefs of the Austrian Netherlands, that She had in the Emperour's Name fignified in Writing to the Directors of the Oftend Company, that for Reafons of State and for the Sake of Peace, his Imperial Majefty had fuf-pended the Exercife of the Octroy to the faid Company, for the Space of Seven Years, as likewise all Trade by the Subjects of the Auftrian Netherlands to the East-Indies during that Time ; prohibiting the faid Directors to fend to the Indies the two Ships, called to fend to the findes the two ships, carled the Emprefs Elizabeth and the Houfe of Auftria, which had been lately built in the Dock at Oftend, and were fitting out there for the Service of the faid Company ; and de-claring that the faid Ships fhall be employed another Way. The Deputies of the States-Ceneral who received this Notification from General who received this Notification from the Imperial Minister, immediately communicated the fame to Mr. Finch and the Marquefs de Fenelon, the British and French Ambaffadours.
