Hague, November 7, N. S.

ON the 5th Instant Count Konigsegg, the Imperial Minister, notified to the States-General, by Order from the Archduchess Governness of the Autrian Netherlands, that She had in the Emperour's Name signified in Writing to the Directors of the Ostend Company, that for Reasons of State and for the Sake of Peace, his Imperial Majesty had suspended the Exercise of the Octroy to the said Company, for the Space of Seven Years, as likewise all Trade by the Subjects of the Austrian Netherlands to the East-Indies during that Time; prohibiting the said Directors to send to the Indies the two Ships, called the Empress Elizabeth and the House of Austria, which had been lately built in the Dock at Ostend, and were fitting out there for the Service of the said Company; and declaring that the said Ships shall be employed another Way. The Deputies of the States-General who received this Notification from the Imperial Minister, immediately communicated the same to Mr. Finch and the Marquess de Fenelon, the British and French Ambassadors.

St. James's, November 6.

This Day M.
