The humble Address of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal in Parliament allembled.

May it pleafe your Excellency, WE the Lords Spiritual and Temporal in Parliament allembled, beg Leave to return our most funcere Thanks for your ex-cellent Speech delivered from the Throne to both Houses of Parliament.

We take this first Opportunity of condo-ling with your Excellency on the Loss of our late most gracious King, of glorious Memo-ry, which could be only repaired by His Ma-jeity's Acceffion to the Throne of His Royal Ancestors; and to affure your Excellency, that the Zeal which we have give expressed that the Zeal which we have ever express'd for the Succession of his Royal House, will make us always continue the fame unfhaken Loyalty to His Majefty, which we on all Occasions manifested to His Royal Father.

Your known Goodness and Caudor leave us no Room to doubt of your Excellency's continuing to reprefent in the ftrongeft Light to His Majesty, the Duty, Loyalty and Affec-tion of His faithful Subjects of Ireland.

WE His Majefty's most duriful and loyal W Subjects, the Commons of Ireland in Parliament allembled, attend your Excellen-cy with the greateft Acknowledgements for your Speech from the Throne to both Ho es of Parliament.
