On the 13th Instant His Majesty's Snow the Happy, Captain Fowkes Commander, arrived at Plymouth from Jamaica, having on board the Corps of Vice-Admiral Ho-lier, who died the 25th of August last. By his Death the Command of His Majesty's Squadron in the West-Indies devolved on Captain St. Lo: Who dispatched the said Snow from Port-Royal, with Letters dated the 30th of September, giving an Account, that he in the Ship he commanded kept cruising off Cartagena, by Order of the deceased Vice-Admiral, till the 6th of September, at which Time the Galleons continued there, all unrigged and in great Want of Men and necessary Stores. Captain St. Lo came the 17th of September into Port Royal, where he rejoined the Squadron which had been obliged to return from off Cartagena to Jamaica to take in Provisions. On the 27th of September His Majesty's Sloop the Tryal arrived at Port Royal from England. Captain St. Lo had been some Days refitting and taking in Provisions, in order to sail with the Squadron under his Command to lye off Cartagena. Captain Fowkes, who left Port Royal the 3d of October, reports, that Captain St. Lo would be ready to put to Sea on the 6th.
