THE following Address having been transmitted to his Grace the Duke of Newcastle one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has by him been presented to His Majesty, who was pleased to receive it very graciously.

To the King's most Excellent Majesty,
The humble Address of the Governour and Company of your Majesty's English Colony of Connecticut in New-England in America.

May it please your Majesty,

WE your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Governour and Company of your Colony of Connecticut, beg Leave with all humble Submission to assure your Majesty, that while we are duly affected at the Death of our late most gracious Sovereign, our Hearts are at the same Time filled with the utmost Joy at your Majesty's happy Accession to the Throne of your Ancestors.

We do with all dutiful and thankful Acknowledgments express the Sense we have of your Majesty's tender Care and Concern for your People, in that you will secure to your Subjects the full Enjoyment of their Religious and Civil Rights, as you have signified the same to us in your most gracious and solemn Declaration from the Throne.

The early Instances of your Majesty's great Goodness to your People, justly call for and cannot fail of meeting with all imaginable Returns of Gratitude and Loyalty: And we beg Leave to assure your Majesty, that in this your Majesty's Colony, there is not a Man that we know of, but what is strictly attached to your Majesty's Interest and Government.

Adding our united and most earnest Prayers to that Almighty God, who rules in the Kingdoms of Men, and giveth them to whomsoever He pleaseth, that as He was most eminently with your Royal Father all the Days of his Life, until He advanced him from the Height of Imperial Dignity to inherit a heavenly Crown; He would assist and guard your sacred Person, bless your Majesty and your Royal Consort with length of Days and a happy Reign, making your Throne yet greater than the Throne of your Royal Father.

And as He hath abundantly increased your illustrious House and Family, so a Light may thence be preserved always to our Israel, and we never want one to rule over us.
