knowledgments express the Sense we have of your Majesty's tender Care and Concern for your People, in that you will fecure to your Subjects the full Enjoyment of their Religious and Civil Rights, as you have fignified the same to us in your most gracious and folemn Declaration from the Throne.

The early Instances of your Majesty's great Goodness to your People, justly call for and cannot fail of meeting with all imaginable Returns of Gratitude and Loyalty: And we beg Leave to assure your Majesty, that in this your Majesty's Colony, there is not a Man that we know of, but what is strictly attached to your Majesty's Interest and Government.

Adding our united and most earnest Prayers to that Almighty God, who rules in the Kingdoms of Men, and giveth them to whomfoever He pleaseth, that as He was most eminently with your Royal Father all the Days of his Life, until He advanced him from the Height of Imperial Dignity to inherit a heavenly Crown; He would affift and guard your facred Person, bless your Majesty and your Royal Confort with length of Days and a happy Reign, making your Throne yet greater than the Throne of your Royal Father.

And as He hath abundantly increased your illustrious House and Family, so a Light may thence be preserved always to our Israel, and we never want one to rule over us.
