When we confider the great Things God has done for us of Old, how we were delivered from Popery and Slavery, and fuch legal Security made for preventing its Return, and that we have fuch a View of having our Religion maintained by the Successors of that fame Prince, under whole Reign the Reformation was first established among us; we do remember with Honour what your Royal Anceftors did fuffer for the Proteftant Re-ligion, and the Prayers of our Church for the diftrelled Queen of Bohemia; which Sufferings God in His Holy Providence has rewarded.

And we do further hereby declare our Pleafure, that the faid Parliament shall, on the faid Twenty third Day of January, be held, and fit for the Dispatch of divers urgent and important Affairs : And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens and Burgefles, and the Committioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their Attendance accordingly at Westminster, on the faid Twenty third Day of January.
