May it please your Majesty, WE your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, do most humbly beg Leave to approach your facred Person with this our humble Address, to condole with your Maje-sty for the inexpressible Loss we have sustained by the Death of our late Sovereign, of bleffed Memory, your dear Father and Royal Predecessor: Which Loss could no otherwise have been repaired to us, than by the Succef-fion of a Prince of your Majesty's Virtues and Experience, under whose Instuence and Protection we may have all possible Assurances of enjoying all our Franchises and Liberties, as they have been most graciously conferred upon us, and transmitted down from Time to Time by your Royal Anecstors.

The Experience and Knowledge your Majesty has had in the Affairs of the British Nation, as well as your great Wisdom, Justice, and Clemency, is no small Enlargement of our Zeal and Affection for your Majesty's Royal Person, and undoubted Right to the Crowns of Great Britain.
